1) Intent of Proposed (Private) Plan Change 40: Wallaceville

Proposed (Private) Plan Change 40 seeks to rezone approximately 63 hectares of the former Wallaceville Ag-Research site and a small part of the Trentham Racecourse property for residential and commercial uses. This includes:

- Rezoning the majority of the properties from Special Activities Zone to Residential, Residential (Centres Overlay) and Business Commercial Zones;
- Rezoning a portion of the area located south of Alexander Road from Rural Lifestyle to Residential and Residential (Centres Overlay); and
- Retaining the existing Rural Lifestyle zoning over the remaining portion of the area located south of Alexander Road.

<u>NOTE:</u> The public notice on 18 March 2015 incorrectly identified the area located south of Alexander Road as being zoned Rural Hill. This land is zoned Rural Lifestyle. We apologise for any inconvenience.
