Upper Hutt

The submission must be completed on Submission Form (Form 5) and must state whether or not you wish to be heard on your submission. Copies of the Submission Form are available on the website and from Council.

Any person may make a submission on the proposal, but if you could gain an advantage in trade competition through the submission, then you may only submit so if you are directly affected by an effect of the proposal that –

- adversely affects the environment; and
- does not relate to trade competition or the effects of trade competition.

The submission period closes on Wednesday 10 March at 5pm.

Process for public participation

The proposal for public participation in the consideration of the proposal under the Act is as follows:

- after the closing date for submission, the Upper Hutt City Council must prepare a summary of decisions requested by submitters and give public notice of the availability of this summary and where the summary and submissions can be inspected; and
- there must be an opportunity for the following persons to make a further submission in support of, or in opposition to, the submissions already made:
 - o any person representing a relevant aspect of the public interest:
 - o any person who has an interest in the proposal greater than the general public has:
 - o the local authority itself; and
- the local authority shall send copies of all submissions on the plan or change to the person who made the request; and
- if a person making a submission or the person who made the request asks to be heard in support of his or her submission, a hearing must be held; and
- after considering the private plan change and undertaking a further evaluation of the plan or change in accordance with section 32AA the Upper Hutt City Council
 - may decline, approve, or approve with modifications the plan or change; and
 - o must give reasons for its decision; and
- the local authority shall give public notice of its decision within 2 years of notifying the proposal and serve it on
 every person who made a submission and on the person who made the request at the same time; and
- any person who has made a submission as well as the person who requested the private plan change has the right to appeal against the decision on the proposal to the Environment Court if,
 - o in relation to a provision or matter that is the subject of the appeal, the person referred to the provision or matter in the person's submission on the proposal; and
 - o in the case of a proposal that is a proposed policy statement or plan, the appeal does not seek the withdrawal of the proposal as a whole.
